

## MESSAGE OUTLINE

### INTRO

- Introduce yourself and the main topic of the day, including memory verse review, the Big Idea, and any fun connection to the overall theme.

### BIBLE STORY

- A video OR picture illustrations (with printable Bible Story Cards to read aloud) that tell(s) the story.

### MESSAGE

- Make the Bible Story more accessible for our context. Tie back to the Big Idea!

### APPLICATION

- What can we practically do/think about with this message? What is the simplest and most memorable way to get the point across?
- Include two points
- Within each point, you can include a brief talking point / production element.

### WRAP UP

- Remind the kids of the memory verse and big idea.
- Provide a simple prayer for the kids to recite.
- EX) Dear God / thank you for being so generous to be / I want to be generous with my time / help me to see the needs of others / and give me courage / to pray for those in need / In Jesus Name / Amen.
  - Start with “thanks”
  - Bring back the points they learned

### EXTRA NOTES:

- What is a “production element?”  
A “production element” is anything extra that can be added to the message to create a more memorable/immersive experience.  
Try to include at least one production element in each message.
  - This could be pictures, music, a story, etc.
- What do the colors on the script mean?
  - Red = on the screen
  - Blue = a note for the production team
  - Purple = additional note for speaker if needed
- How long should my outline be?
  - Aim for one page (The goal is for the speaker to have one page to keep up with)
