By investing into each student's life, a small group leader can make an eternal difference in that "one" student and the generations to come. Thank you again for your willingness to serve the next generation.

# ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A SMALL GROUP LEADER

- Prepare for the weekend
  - Provide a clean vehicle to transport students from the church to the host home and back. You will not have to drive to the Saturday afternoon activities.
  - Plan to stay at the host home with your group for the duration of the weekend. Ensure the safety of the group
  - Never leave the group or individual alone
  - Never be alone with a student
  - Stay in communication with the group, knowing where everyone is at all times during camp.
  - Never allow students to sleep in the same bed with another student or leader
- Act as mentors and confidants, not the student's parents.
- Participate in worship, activities, & take notes (leaders go first!)
  - Ensure students bring their Bible, booklet, and pen to all sessions and small group times.
  - Be energized and stay engaged! Don't sit back and relax!
- Build relationships with the students in your group
- Have FUN and help students have FUN as well!
- Have a personal, spiritual conversation with each student in the group at some point in the week (during meal times, rec time, devo time, etc)
- Be on time and follow the schedule
- Take up student's cell phones Friday
  - Take up cell phones at check-in (once student arrives to your designated area) Ziplock bag provided
  - Give phones back to students 45 minutes before arriving to Milestone
- Help students take NEXT STEPS (baptism, serving, be part of a small group, etc...)
- Go through the 7 day devotional with your small group after camp

# SATURDAY REC TIME



## **BELIEFS & EXPECTATIONS**

At Milestone, we communicate God's truth on love, sex, and dating. What we believe about these issues and how we communicate them to students are both of the utmost importance.

#### WHAT WE BELIEVE

#### 1. Marriage

Christian marriage is a beautiful covenant relationship between God, one man, and one woman. Jesus affirms this powerful union in Matthew 19:4-6: 4 He answered, "Have you not read that he who created them from the beginning made them male and female, 5 and said, 'Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? 6 So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate." - Jesus

#### 2. Sex

Sex is meant to be between one man and one woman within the covenant of marriage. Anything outside of that is perversion and sin. Pre-marital sex, homosexual activity, pornography, and anything else outside of sex between a married man and woman is sin.

1 Corinthians 6:18-20: 18 Flee from sexual immorality. All other sins a person commits are outside the body, but whoever sins sexually, sins against their own body. 19 Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; 20 you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies.

#### 3. Gender

We believe that God created gender and is the one who defines gender. We do not define ourselves, God defines us and gives us our identity. As such, we believe that bisexuality, transgenderism, and gender fluidity are not what God has intended a person to identify as. Genesis 1:27: So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

# **BELIEFS & EXPECTATIONS**

At Milestone, we communicate God's truth on love, sex, and dating. What we believe about these issues and how we communicate them to students are both of the utmost importance.

#### WHAT WE EXPECT

- 1. We expect you to uphold all the above beliefs regarding marriage, sex, and gender.
- 2. We expect you to communicate all of God's truth with grace and love. While we may not condone someone's actions, we also do not condemn that person.
- 3. How you communicate in regard to these topics to a confessed believer is different than how you communicate to someone who does not have a relationship with Jesus.
  - a. We do not expect someone who doesn't have a relationship with God to live their life according to the Bible and God's standard. As such, the best response for a student who is not a confessed believer in Jesus is to love them, pray for them, and believe for God to open their heart to receive from him.
  - b. Someone who is a confessed believer in Jesus, has a relationship with God, yet is living in contraction with God's Word on love, sex, and dating, may be more open to a conversation about God's view on this issue. For that type of student, the best response is to start with the standard of God's Word as authority and go to the Bible for the answers on love, sex, and dating. All of this should always be done with a heart of love, and communicated with grace.





# POST FALL RETREAT EXPECTATIONS (DEVO)

Our heart's desire is not to just put on an event, but to start the discipleship process for hundreds of students! Because of this, we are all going to do a 7 day Devotional on the YouVersion Bible App that the Elevate team has made just for Fall Retreat.

Here are our specific expectations of you for this Devotional plan.

- Do the devotional with your small group.
  - Text daily encouragements in the group, text what you got out of the readings, have dialogue in your text group about the habit of Bible reading and growing through God's Word.
- The goal is for each person in your small group to complete all 7 days within a 14 day period.
  - If you miss a day or two, no worries! You can make it up.
- Meet with your small group in person one time in the 2 weeks following Fall Retreat.
  - Talk about how each one is doing in their relationship with God post camp.
  - Talk about each person's next steps following camp.

Encourage and pray with them!

#### How do we make this devotional a success?

We are making this a staple for all of our camps / retreats moving forward. As we have talked with students, the #1 key for getting students engaged is for you as leader to individually reach out to the student and tell them you want to do it together.

• You as a leader asking the student to do it with you beats any announcement from stage or Instagram post about it.

Pro tip: when you give phones back on Sunday after camp, have everyone download the YouVersion app and sign up to start devo together.

Do the devo "with friends"

# **EFFECTIVE SMALL GROUP TIME**

Small group time is such an important part of camps and retreats. It allows time for students to connect with their leaders as well as others in their group. It's also an opportunity for students to process what God is doing in their hearts. Each small group will happen right after a session. The goal is to get students to share what God is speaking to them.

#### Keys to effective small group time

- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you and give you the words to say!
   He wants to help you lead your small group.
- Small group leaders are there to facilitate discussion, not dominate the conversation (80% listening 20% talking)
- Engage in meaningful, spiritual dialogue with students during small group time.
  - As needed, you can have small talk / have some fun, but take advantage of every opportunity to process with students what God is speaking to them.
- During small group time, stay on the topic being discussed during the previous session.
- Ask questions to help students process what God is doing in their hearts.
  - Lead off your small groups by asking questions like,
     "What stuck out to you during the service?" "What was your main takeaway from the message?" "What did you feel like God was speaking to you in this service?
  - As students share, ask follow up questions like, "Would you tell me more about that?" "What does that mean to you?" "How can you live that out in your life?"
- If students are not opening up, you as the leader go first and share what God is speaking to you.
  - Being open, honest, and transparent with the students you're leading is a great way to build trust with them.
  - Be careful not to "over-share" or let students in your group in on areas that you are currently struggling with. We encourage you to process up with your leaders (dean, pastor, small group leader, etc) about any areas in your life that you are currently struggling with or needing to grow in.
- If there are thoughts / opinions shared that you know are contrary to God's Word, you are entrusted to lovingly bring the small group back to the truth of God's Word

# **EFFECTIVE SMALL GROUP TIME**

#### Keys to effective small group time

- Encourage discussion from each person in the small group. As best as you can, don't let one person or just a couple people dominate all the conversation.
- Pray for the students in your group. Especially if a student opens up about something really vulnerable and emotional for them, don't move on too quickly. Take that moment to encourage them, speak life to them, and pray for them right there.







# MINISTRY TIME

During services at camp, we will give opportunities for students to respond to the message and receive prayer from their small group leaders.

#### **General Prayer Guidelines**

- Focus on listening, encouraging, and praying, not trying to teach or preach.
- Start by asking an initial question like, "How can I pray for you?"
- Take time to listen, encourage, and ask follow up questions.
- Be aware of body language and facial expressions. Smile and be compassionate, don't look shocked by what a student shares.
- Prioritize praying with the students in your group.
- Pray with students of the same sex.
  - this includes students praying with students.
- Pray with eyes opened.
  - Always be aware of surroundings & see how God may be ministering to the student you're praying for)
  - Look for students who raise their hand during altar call
- If you are unsure how to handle a situation with the group or individual in the group, contact the assigned dean.
- Ensure that each student that needs prayer gets prayer.
  - Don't spend a long amount of time on one student if others are waiting.
- Use wisdom when praying or prophesying over students.
   It is often unwise to prophesy about major life decisions:
  - Prophesying about future spouses
  - Being called to ministry
  - Going or not going to college, etc...

# **LEADING SOMEONE TO CHRIST**

During camp, you may have the opportunity to lead a student to Jesus. This is one of the most incredible things to get to be a part of as a leader! Here are some guidelines for you to do this.

- Always ask the student an opening question like,
   "Why are you responding? How can I pray for you?"
- Don't assume a student is saved, be sure to ask the question,
   "Have you surrendered your life to Christ?" Tell me about when you gave your life to Christ?"
  - Explain Salvation and lead in prayer
- Use Scripture in your prayer. Praying God's Word is the most powerful prayer you can pray!
- The Romans Road is a great way to explain Salvation
  - Romans 3:23
  - Romans 6:23
  - Romans 5:8
  - Romans 10:9-10
- Here are some helpful truths when talking with someone about salvation
  - "You were created to have a relationship with God."
  - "Sin separates you from God."
  - "Sin leads to death."
  - "Salvation is God's free gift to you."
  - "Jesus is the only way to God."
  - "We are saved by God's Grace, through faith."

# **TOUGHISSUES**

Throughout the course of the week, there may be students who open up about tough issues like same sex attraction, drug use, sexual addictions, rape, abuse, etc... Here are a few ways to be equipped on how to handle these situations:

- 1. Always talk about sensitive topics like this in private, and gather information one-on-one, not in the group setting. We want to protect students in these private and difficult situations.
- 2. Be aware of your facial expressions and body language. You do not want to look shocked as a student opens up to you.
- 3. Never promise, "I won't tell anyone." Instead, reassure the student that this is a safe place.
- 4. If there is ever a report of physical or sexual abuse, we have a legal responsibility to report it immediately. Here is the step-by-step process of what to do:
  - Collect the information told you by the student, but don't dig for more information or specifics than what the student volunteers to share.
     Report the incident to your small group leader dean the same day you hear of the incident.
  - If any intense spiritual warfare situations come up (where it seems like there may be evil spirits manifesting), please do the following:
    - Call small group leader dean immediately and bring them into situation
    - Separate the student who seems like they may be manifesting from the rest of the group. If the student won't leave, have the rest of the group leave. (See Emotional Disclosure Statement at the end of this handout)

# HOW TO PREPARE FOR FALL RETREAT

#### Prepare physically by:

• Getting plenty of rest before camp.

#### Prepare spiritually by:

- Repenting of sin
- Fasting & prayer
- Building up your faith come expecting for God to move







# SMALL GROUP LEADER DEANS

You will have an assigned "Dean" as a resource to you during camp.

The main objective of a Small Group Leader Dean at camp is to be the primary resource, cheerleader, advocate, and coach for small group leaders. Our deans are seasoned leaders with us who we trust to help you as a small group leader.

Your dean will be your first point of contact for anything you need (practical questions, interpersonal issue with students in your group, advice on how to handle a situation, etc)

# COMMUNICATION

#### **PARENTS**

- When you receive your assigned group, we ask that you individually text the parents of the students in your group.
  - Introduce yourself as their leader
  - Express excitement to get to know their student this weekend
  - Ask how you can be praying for their student going into the weekend

#### **STUDENTS**

- When you receive your assigned group, we ask that you make a group text with the leaders and all students in your group
  - Introduce yourself as their leader
  - Express excitement about getting to know them this weekend
  - Do a "get to know you" text introduction with everyone (name, grade, school, interesting fact, what you're looking forward to this week, etc)

#### **DURING THE WEEKEND**

 Small Group Leader Deans will communicate with small group leaders that are assigned to them by way of the App GroupMe during camp. The deans will communicate all important information as well as changes that may occur during the weekend.

# FREE TIME / HOST HOME TIME

Fall Retreat is going to be an incredibly fun weekend of connecting with students and helping them take steps in their walk with God. We want to help you steward the time you have with them well, especially the down times in the schedule, like free time, and time at the Host Home.

With that, we are no longer allowing Silent Football, or any other games that involve consequences, to be a part of our camps and retreats.

We ask that you help us uphold this new and higher standard that we are expecting of all small group leaders and students that attend camps and retreats.

# MEDICATION POLICY

We have updated the terms of our medication policy for camps and retreats.

Going forward, all prescription and over-the-counter medication must be checked in to our medical personnel and ABSOLUTELY NO prescription or over-the-counter medication is allowed in Host Homes where minor students are staying. This is for the safety of all students and leaders who attend camp with us.

All medical information is kept confidential and only our medical professional will have details about medications that students and leaders bring to camp.

We will provide our nurse with over-the-counter medications to administer as the need arises. The list of these medications is below for your convenience:

Acetaminophen (Tylenol)
Ibuprofen (Motrin/Advil)
Phenylephrine decongestant (Sudafed PE)
Pseudoephedrine decongestant (Sudafed)
Antihistamine/allergy medicine (Benadryl)
Guaifenesin cough syrup (Robitussin)
Bismuth subsalicylate (Pepto Bismol)
Anti-diarrheal medicine (Imodium AD)
Calcium carbonate (TUMS)
Anti-nausea medicine (Emetrol)
